

#### **ASSISTANT PROFESSOR, LAKEHEAD UNIVERSITY**

Ellen is an assistant professor in the Faculty of Education at Lakehead University. Her research interests are in policy and practice of climate change education in the Canadian K-12 system. She teaches Environmental Education (B.Ed) and Climate Change Education (M.Ed) in the Faculty of Education, and has engaged with hundreds of in-service teachers in professional development workshops.
